SESSION DESCRIPTION: This session examines the impact of CalSTRS/PERS on college finances and explores options for managing these rising future costs. We will survey the myriad of ways that districts are addressing this fiscal challenge and will feature two in detail: San Luis Obispo County Community College District and San Bernardino Community College District. The panel will discuss latest state retirement system developments, proposed state budget funding, funding sources and strategies, and dealing with Boards and negotiations.

Fee waivers, enrollment fee reimbursement grants, grants to pay other student fees or costs, and other recommendations will be discussed.
