January 11	Transfer level math/English.	Use the student's first academic year, not fiscal year.
January 11	Transfer level math courses definition.	Moved discussion to the Academic Affairs division.
January 11	3-year average of FTES.	Strike section (B)(i) from code that excludes growth FTES from three-year average.
February 8	9 CTE Units.	Count only if 9 units are within same two-digit TOPS Code but add in SAM Code D.
February 8	Cap on year over year increase.	If cap required by DOF, it should be on TCR, not only on success. Note: We did not make a recommendation on an appropriate cap level.
February 8	Transfer to 4-year university.	Prefer to leave it alone.

March 15	Counting highest award.	Count only the highest award achieved in a given fiscal year between ADT, AA/AS, BA/BS, or Credit Certificates. Achievements in different fiscal years is ok.
March 15	Transfer counts for single district only.	Ok as an alternative to DOF proposal but need to determine how to prioritize districts (i.e. last district enrolled vs. district where most units earned). Chancellor's Office to research and determine which method is most advantageous.
March 15	Transfer counts only if 30 transferable units and 12 within last year.	Not in support of this.
March 15	Transfer counts to Cal Grant eligible universities only.	Not in support of this.

March 15	Eliminate counts for nonresidents.	None – no data was presented to support recommendation.

April 12	Three-year average of every FTES category.	Calculate three-year average for reported credit FTES only, excluding special admit/correctional facilities first; leave all others as is.
April 12	Adjust SCFF rates to keep funding at 70%-20%-10%.	Ok, but we need to see analysis.

Count only one of the following earned by a student in the same fiscal year (with a district funded for the outcome that generates the highest number of points under the SCFF): (1) associate degree for transfer, (2) associate degree, (3) baccalaureate degree, (4) credit certificate (16 units or greater).
May 10	Count the number of students who successfully transfer to any four-year university, with the requirement the student has completed at least 12 units system-wide prior to transfer, with an outcome credited to each district in which student enrolled prior to transfer.	Count only a student's transfer to a four-year university to a district only if the student completed 12 or more units in the district prior to transfer.

May 10	Count the number of students who completed nine or more CTE units in the same academic year.	Specify student must complete nine or more CTE units in the same TOP code in order to generate points for that particular student success outcome.
May 10	Funding for non-resident students, special admit students, and students in correctional facilities.	Statues to be amended to exclude counts of students whose enrollment was exclusively as a non-resident student, special admit student, or student in correctional facilities.
