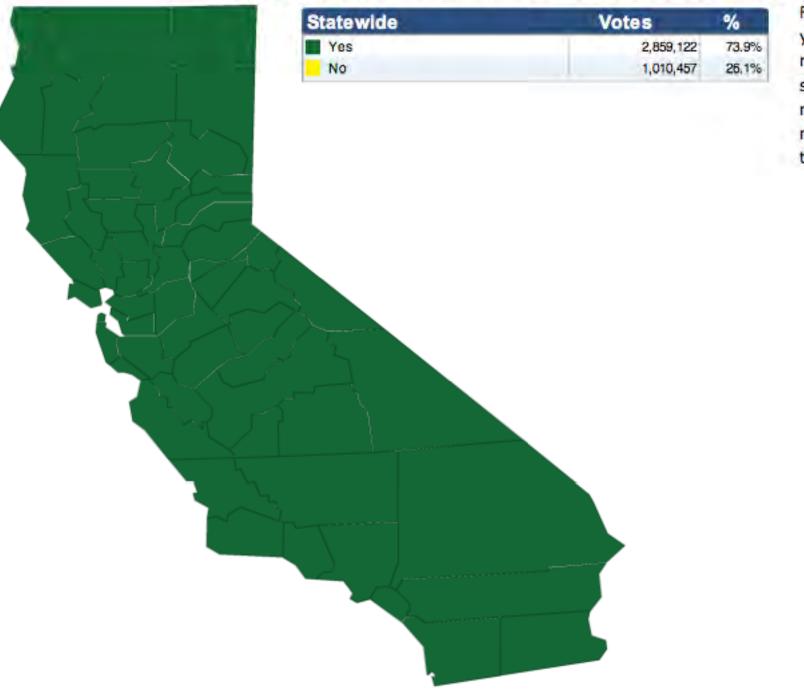

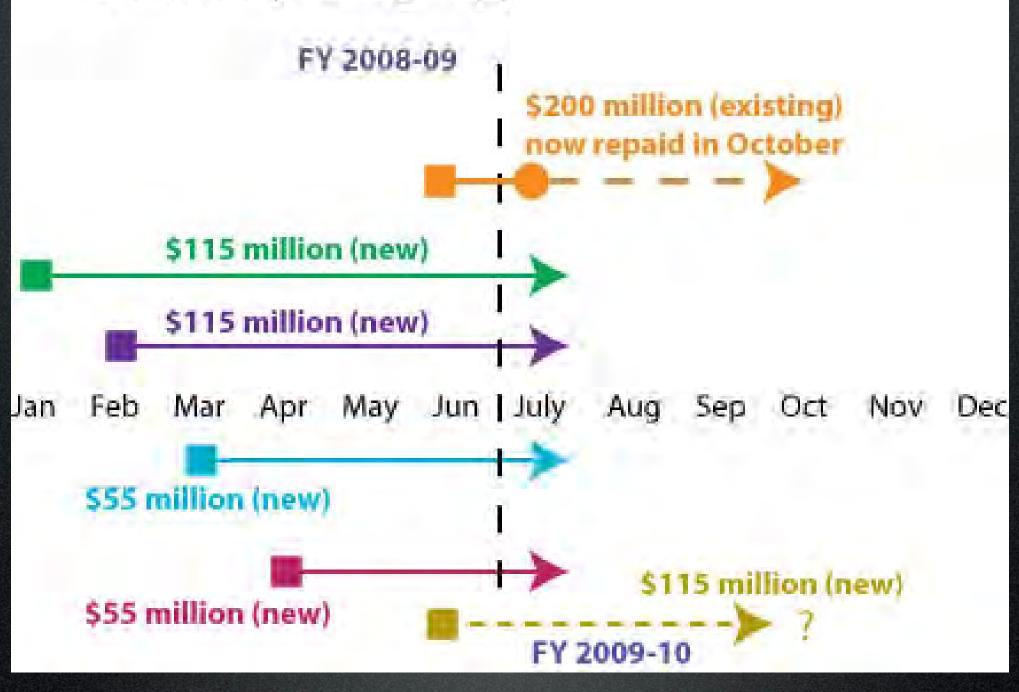

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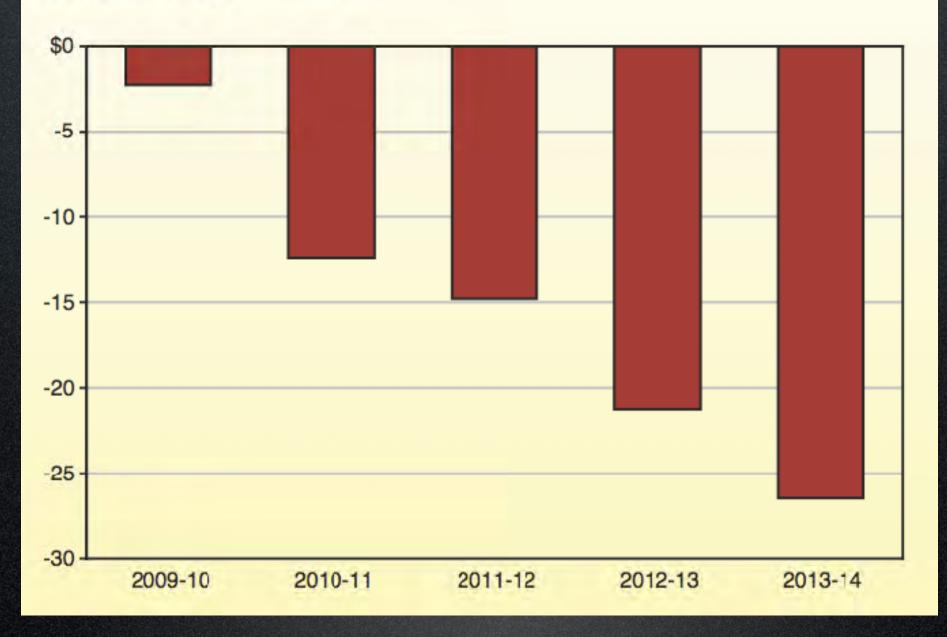
What the cuts mean

Enrollment - 250,000 lost students

- Reduction in funding for 56,000 FTES (property tax, apportionment, PE reduction)
- Expected loss of 50,000 unfunded FTES
- Equivalent to shutting the University of California
- 49% reduction to categorical programs
- Inflation-adjusted funding per FTES at 1982 level. 119 actual cut from 2006-07.
