



Increasing cost pressures continue, such as step and column movement and growing pension contributions, in a world where economic growth is projected to slow down. In this session we will discuss strategies to avoid impasse, develop fair share formulas and contingency language under the new SCFF and maintain a balance between fiscal health, student programs and competitive compensation. In the event that you are at impasse, we will discuss what to expect during mediation, fact finding and beyond.

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
