



Established Relationships Help Mitigate High-Profile, Controversial Actions by your Police or Security Department when They Happen

RELATIONSHIPS

Campus Police or Security are, and Should be Viewed as Another Important Department of the Institution, not a Necessary Evil or Occupation Force

Relationships are Key! Building Trust and Respect Leads to Collaboration and Cooperation Leading to Greater Safety and Security






